

June 27, 1949

The regular meeting of the City Planning Board was called to order at 8:00 P. M. with Chairman J. C. Lawless presiding.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

Members present were: J. C. Lawless, J. F. Behan, J. I. McAdams, H. A. Holbrook.

A replacement for Mr. Blair was discussed, and it was suggested that the Director contact Mr. Albert Alie to see if he would be willing to serve, if not, a short meeting will be called later to discuss the matter further.

The Director then reported on the survey to be taken at the railroad crossing on Third and Chestnut Street, at the request of the City Council. It was decided that a 12 hour check, from 7 A. M. to 7 P. M., would supply the necessary data.

The Director then read a letter from the State Planning and Development Commission concerning the purchasing of the Zoning Digest and the Planning Advisory Service by the state, with the various active Planning Boards sharing the cost. The publication would then be available for the use of the various communities in the state. It was recommended that a letter be sent endorsing such action, but stating that no funds are available this year from the Dover Planning Board.

On a motion by Mr. Behan, seconded by Mr. McAdams, the board voted that the Director's pay be raised to \$75.83 per pay period.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:15 P. M., on a motion by Mr. Holbrook.
