

PLANNING BOARD MEETING

October 23, 1950

The regular meeting of the City Planning Board was called to order at 8:00 P.M., with Chairman J. C. Lawless presiding.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

Members present were: J. C. Lawless, F. W. Pease, A. W. Alie, J. H. McAdams, H. A. Holbrook, and E. W. Christensen.

The Director led a discussion of the proposed 1951 budget, and all figures were explained in detail. On a motion by H. A. Holbrook, seconded by A. W. Alie, it was unanimously voted that a proposed budget totalling \$4,654.00, as recommended by the Director and the Finance Committee, be accepted and submitted to the City Manager.

Due to the recognition given the "Traffic Study", in the A.S.P.O. monthly letter, there has been a large demand for this report. It was decided that copies be sent to those that have requested it up to the present time, but that a policy be established some time in the near future so that we will not be giving out these reports indefinitely at our own expense.

As a major project for the coming year, the Director suggested an overhaul of the Zoning Ordinance and Map, and explained a few of the things to be considered.

Phillip Pease, Public Works Superintendent, discussed the questions sent to the Board members during the past month regarding a Sub-Division Control Ordinance.

The Director reported on several projects including the progress being made in re-activating the sub-committee to work on the Building Code, the Recreation Plan. The Director also summarized the activities of the Dover Housing Authority.

The meeting adjourned at 9:45 P.M., on a motion by H. A. Holbrook.
