MINUTES OF MEETING

HELD: Thursday, April 21, 1960
7:30 P.M.

ATTENDING: Chairman Eugene S. Meserve, Arthur J. DuBois, Robert Labrie, Laurence R. Nealley, E. Vincent Mc Donald, Robert L. Fox, Robert N. Gillis, Arthur J. Grimes, and John Maglaras, representing Mayor Patrick J. Greene.

STAFF: Doris M. Desautel, Planning Director

Chairman Eugene S. Meserve called a special meeting of the Planning Board to order at 8:00 P.M. Secretary Arthur J. DuBois called the roll. A communication from Mayor Patrick J. Greene requesting consideration of the parking problem by the Planning Board was read.

Following lengthy discussion, the planning director was directed to conduct comprehensive studies, including cost studies, for several proposed sites. The sites are the American House Parking Lot, the Central Court area, and the improvement of the First Street Parking lot. Other investigations to be made include the status of Upper Henry Law Park, the additional facilities as a result of the construction of the new railroad station and the possibility of moving of industry through an Urban Renewal program.

Miss Desautel was further directed, on motion by Mr. Fox, seconded by Mr. Labrie, to write to the Mayor that it is impossible to assemble complete information on a large project such as new parking lot sites in a short time and that when the information is compiled and the report completed, the report will be submitted promptly.


John Maglaras, representing the Mayor, was present. He discussed the general objectives of the Parking and Traffic Committee which has been functioning for some two years. He expressed the hope that all groups could combine efforts to ultimately resolve the problem.

The members suggested that the matter be given further consideration at the next regular meeting of the Planning Board, May 2, 1960 and that in the meantime the individual members will observe the central area for additional study.

A discussion followed concerning the sending of communications from the Planning Board Office. In order to avoid conflict and confusion in the future, it was voted on motion by Mr. Labrie, seconded by Mr. Fox, that no communication shall be issued from the Planning Board Office until approved by the Planning Board and all communications shall be directed to and from the Planning Board.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 10:35 P.M.
