Those members present were Amanda Russell, Keith Holt, Carolyn Mebert, Rachel Burdin, Jessica Rozzo and Kathy Morrison. Zachary Koehler was excused. Also present was Superintendent William Harbron and Business Administrator Michael Limanni.

The Board entered a non-public session at 6:01 p.m. to discuss RSA 91-A:3 II(k), consideration by a school board of entering into a student or pupil tuition contract authorized by RSA 194 or RSA 195-A, which, if discussed in public, would likely benefit a party or parties whose interests are adverse to those of the general public or the school district that is considering a contract, including any meeting between the school boards, or committees thereof, involved in the negotiations. A contract negotiated by a school board shall be made public prior to its consideration for approval by a school district, together with minutes of all meetings held in nonpublic session, any proposals or records related to the contract, and any proposal or records involving a school district that did not become a party to the contract, shall be made public. Approval of a contract by a school district shall occur only at a meeting open to the public at which, or after which, the public has had an opportunity to participate.

The Board entered a non-public session to discuss tuition and labor contracts for the Dover School District, as well as a request received for a re-hearing for a Dover High School student.

Carolyn Mebert moved, Rachel Burdin seconded, to adjourn the nonpublic session at 6:59 p.m. A roll call **VOTE PASSED 6/0 (all in favor)**.
