Hi Tom,

Here is our quote for the sounds system for the new HS athletic fields. I know we had discussed the possibility of mounting speakers on both sides of the field so that the home crowd doesn't have the sound from the speakers blasting in their ears, however after further research and best practices we went with a different design. We found that most similar athletic fields have their speakers all on one side, typically on the press box or similar structure. The speakers are configured in such a way that there are 2 aimed and calibrated for the away side and the other 2 are aimed and calibrated for the home side. The speakers for the away side will be positioned so that the sound they are throwing out will go over the heads of the home side and not blast them out with too high of a volume. The speakers for the home side will be angled towards those bleachers and be at a lower, more appropriate volume for them.

Another reason for not pole mounting the speakers on the away side to aim at the home side was due to the wiring and conduit in place. We cannot, and will not, run speaker wire in the same conduit as

power or communication cables, especially power wires. It was unclear if there would be a dedicated conduit for speaker wire, but it would be a requirement for us to put speakers there and would add a lot of cost to run all that dedicated conduit. Finally, speaker wire run that long will cause some power (wattage) loss from the amplifier, which would require a more powerful amp.

The rest of the system is as discussed. It will have a mixer with room for expansion, a wired mic for the booth, a dual channel wireless system that includes a handheld mic and lavalier mic, audio inputs in the booth, and a rack to house everything. Audio inputs include XLR mic input, RCA stereo inputs, and a Bluetooth connection.
