

DOVER PLANNING BOARD
MINUTES OF MEETING

HELD: Monday, Feb. 7, 1966

The Meeting of the Dover Planning Board was called to order at
7:30 p.m. on Monday, Feb. 7, 1966 in the Board Office.

Motion by Sheldon, seconded by Tuttle, that the Minutes of the
previous meeting be accepted as written. Motion adopted unanimously.

Discussion then followed concerning a communication from Mr. John E.
Galt, a student at Dartmouth College, inquiring as to the possibility of a
position with the Dover Planning Board this summer.

Motion by Tuttle, seconded by Sheldon, that the Board contact Mr.
Galt to determine his salary requirements and to inform him that the Board
is trying to hire a full time planner who may need an assistant. Such a
letter would make no commitments on the part of the Board but merely would
express interest in Mr. Galt's offer.

Mr. Sheldon then stated that of the twenty-six letters sent to
various colleges and universities with respect to the opening of the position
of Planning Director in Dover only three were answered and of the nineteen
individual letters no-one had answered. The Board decided that a new adver-
tisement should be placed in the ASPO "Jobs in Planning" Sheet.

Mr. Sheldon then resigned from the subcommittee and Mr. Ouellette
was appointed as Chairman.


There followed a brief discussion, in which Mr. Leonard C. Campbell
took part, which was a report by Mr. Chick and Mr. Tuttle on a conference
they attended in Concord pertaining to the new Federal laws on housing and
urban development and public works and economic development.

The Board reviewed the possibility of being in a better position
to obtain Federal funds if Dover was in the Regional Planning Group. Mr.
Campbell suggested that the Board give some thought to getting together with
Somersworth and Rochester and forming some type of planning group which could
have a large staff working for these three cities. Mr. Campbell stated that
he had already discussed the matter with Rochester and they had expressed
some interest and that he was to meet with Somersworth and he would also
discuss the matter with them.

Motion by Sheldon, seconded by Akerman, to reaffirm the budget figures submitted to the City Council for the 1966 Planning Board Budget.

Motion by Sheldon, seconded by Tuttle, to adjourn the meeting. The Meeting was adjourned at 9:30 p.m.
