The Meeting of the Dover Planning Board was called to order at  
7:30 p.m. in the Board Office at City Hall.

Motion by Tuttle, seconded by Akerman, that the Minutes of the  
previous meeting be accepted as written. Motion adopted unanimously.

Mr. Tuttle inquired about progress being made with Metcalf &  
Eddy and Mr. Chick reported that Mary Louise Hancock had been advised that  
Metcalf & Eddy had been hired and that they were to get in touch with one  
another with respect to action to be taken. Mr. Chick reported that he told  
Mr. Woglom to call Mr. Bonkoski at the Housing and Home Finance Agency and  
inform him that matters were progressing and moving as fast as anticipated  
in order that they be advised that Dover was doing something about the  
situation.

A lengthy discussion ensued between Board Members relating to  
the proposed sites for industrial zoning. The Report of the Subcommittee was  
given to the Board and accepted with respect to its recommendations on I-1,  
I-2, buffer zones and related matters.

After extensive discussion it was decided that the next regular  
meeting of the Planning Board would be held on June 6, 1966 and that on June 7  
a public meeting would be held at which time the public would be invited to  
express their opinions regarding the proposed industrial sites. It was  
decided that letters would be sent to all persons having property in the  
proposed industrial sites as well as abutting or adjacent land owners in order  
that anyone having an interest would have an opportunity to attend the public  
meeting.

Motion by Chick, seconded by Akerman, that the Meeting be  
adjourned. Motion adopted unanimously.

The Meeting was adjourned at 10:30 p.m.
