MINUTES OF MEETING

Chairman Sheldon called the Meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. in the Planning Board Office.

At Roll Call the following members were present: Chairman Robert T. Sheldon, Vice-Chairman Raymond R. Ouellette, Secretary Wallace I. Akerman, Albert O. Bernard, Donald E. Chick, Hugh C. Tuttle.

Also attending were Planning Director William R. Chandler and two residents of Barry Street.

ITEM NO. 2: REFERRAL BY CITY COUNCIL OF RESOLUTION NO. 29-67 (Maintenance of Barry Street and Smith Well Road as dead-end streets).

On motion by Chick, seconded by Bernard, the Planning Board voted unanimously to recommend to the City Council that Barry Street remain a dead-end street for the time being subject to the provision that a proper turn-around be constructed according to the Subdivision Regulations and City Construction Specifications.

On motion by Chick, seconded by Bernard, the Planning Board voted unanimously to recommend to the City Council that Smith Well Road be maintained as a dead end street and that the City Engineer be authorized to conduct a survey of Smith Well Road to determine the best location for a turn-around at the end of the existing public way.

ITEM NO. 3: CONSIDERATION OF TOPICS PROGRAM FOR DOVER.

The Planning Board voted unanimously to recommend to the City Council the concurrence of a proposed secondary system as submitted by the New Hampshire Department of Public Works and Highways and that the City Council adopt a resolution calling for the City's participation in the TOPICS Program, and that the New Hampshire Department of Public Works and Highways be requested to initiate immediately an engineering study of Recommendation No. 9 (Central Avenue from Glenwood Avenue to traffic circle) under the TOPICS Program). On motion by Akerman, seconded by Ouellette. Motion adopted unanimously.

On motion by Tuttle, seconded by Akerman, the Meeting was adjourned at 8:00 p.m. Motion adopted unanimously.
