Mr. Santovasi,

Thank you for your follow-up.

The whole idea here is to keep the residents on the odd side from crossing the street anywhere near the dangerous curve, so your alternative scenarios are not viable. Now that I have a better understanding of your operations, I am certain that this request can be scaled back significantly. At a minimum, the request is to have five (5) properties on the odd side- this includes #97 to #119 – be reassigned from Rural to City delivery. The properties on the even side may remain Rural if necessary.

Can you please provide me the appropriate contact information for the union officials involved here, so they may be directly implicated in the liability loop. I would like to have a direct conversation with them on the public safety concerns and I am happy to meet anyone who wishes for a site review.

Officer Speidel,

As per our conversation and your letter dated August 1, 2011, I checked into the contractual legalities of trading the deliveries from Rural delivery to City delivery. The unions will not agree to swap any territory, therefore the only other options I can see to ensure the safety of all involved would be to move the deliveries between 97 and 112 Sixth street to either the same location as 97 or 112 or to move them onto either Hillside or Autumn streets where the carrier would be off Sixth Street. If you think that one of those scenarios would be agreeable I could draft a letter using safety reasons and request that they relocate the boxes to such location. Please let me know if this is something you would like me to do and which scenario you think would work best. Thank you for your help in this matter.
