NEW BUSINESS

Chief Colarusso advised the Police Facility Building Committee that the goal of the committee should be to build the best facility possible with the funds allocated. Deputy Mayor Carrier agreed and stated that one of the first goals should be to establish possible site locations for the new police facility.

Chief Colarusso informed the committee that as of this date, five sites have been identified as possibilities to include Orchard Street Lot, the lot behind Robbins Auto, School Street Lot, Locust Street – (across from Moore Business Forms), and St. Charles Church.

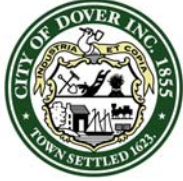
After a general discussion, it was decided that the Grimes Lot, the old Bingo Hall on Cataract Avenue, McIntosh College, and the Culinary School should also be added as potential site locations.

Each member then gave their opinions and views on the locations listed and after much discussion between the committee members, it was decided that additional information would be gathered by Captain Breault and presented to the Police Facility Building Committee at their next scheduled meeting.

Captain Breault provided the committee with site considerations as well as an overview of the four basic design and construction delivery methods.

Deputy Mayor Carrier requested that Captain Breault have a list of “must haves” and “would likes” for the new police facility available at the next committee meeting.

The committee agreed that goal for the Police Facility Building Committee is to provide a facility that the community can afford. The immediate goal of the committee is to continue to work on site selections and type of building design/construction delivery methods.

CITIZEN'S FORUM

Tony McManus, Vice Chairman of the Parking Commission addressed the Police Facility Building Committee on several concerns involving the Parking Commission. He advised the Committee that the Parking Commission is opposed to using the Orchard Street Lot for a new police facility as it would be a severe impact on the Parking Commission's goal of trying to erect a parking garage within the City. He advised the Committee that he, personally, felt that Robbins Auto would be the best location for a new police facility.

Arthur Burke of 2 Union Street advised the Committee that he was opposed to a new parking garage and police facility being built within the Orchard Street Lot. He stated that he was opposed to a parking garage being built anywhere within the City of Dover. He advised the Committee that although a new Waterfront Development was being erected, he felt that the right bank of the Cocheco River by Public Works would be a good place for a new Police Facility.

OTHER BUSINESS

Chief Colarusso advised he would like to meet every couple of weeks if it is feasible for the committee members. After a brief discussion, it was decided that as of right now, the Police Facility Building Committee will meet every two weeks.

The next scheduled Police Facility Building Committee meeting is scheduled for February 19, 2013 at 5:00 P.M.

A motion was made to adjourn the February 5, 2013 Police Facility Building Committee meeting by Chief Colarusso and seconded by Bob Carrier. All members present were in favor.
