A. EMERGENCY OPERATIONS PLAN PRESENTATION

Fire Chief Hagman gave a PowerPoint presentation regarding the Local Emergency Operations Plan (LEOP) to the Council.

B. CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS PROGRAM (CIP) PRESENTATION

City Manager Joyal, referring to Page 20 of the CIP booklet, spoke about the projects on the list. He said there were two items that had amendments:

1. Public Safety Communication Upgrade needs to be moved up to Year 1 to coordinate with a Homeland Security grant.
2. Add a new project for Year 1 for the WWII Memorial.

Deputy Mayor Carrier talked about a 2023 celebration for Dover's 400 year anniversary and the need to start saving money for it.

Mayor Weston asked if there was consensus from the Council for the WWII Memorial. There was consensus.

Mayor Weston asked if there was consensus to move the Public Safety Communication Upgrade forward to Year 1 of the CIP. There was consensus.



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City Manager Joyal said the Council should look at changing the City's policy levels to reflect the projects in the CIP. He noted that if the CIP remains as predicted the City should start to see in the years ahead that the impact on property taxes will be less and less to the point where there will be no impact.
